School based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SATs)

Changes to SATs from 1 July 2013

THE USER CHOICE 2010–2015 PROGRAM

The User Choice Program provides public funding for the delivery of accredited, entry level training to apprentices and trainees, **including school based apprentices and trainees**.

The Queensland User Choice Program enables apprentices, trainees and their employers to select a preferred Registered Training Organisation from a list of Pre-qualified Suppliers for the delivery of accredited training to meet their specific needs.

Under the User Choice 2010-2015 program, funding specifically targets the occupational outcomes of the apprenticeship or traineeship.

CHANGES TO THE USER CHOICE 2010-2015 POLICY FROM 1 JULY 2013

From **1 July 2013**, the User Choice Policy was changed to remove the 100% Government contribution to SATs and align future funding to the priority level of the qualification.

- Priority One (100 percent subsidised) lead to occupations deemed to be critical priorities in Queensland.
- Priority Two (75 percent subsidised) lead to occupations not deemed critical in Queensland but considered as high priorities.
- Priority Three (50 percent subsidised) lead to occupations not deemed critical in Queensland but considered as medium priorities.

This change of funding will provide an opportunity for successful SATs to enter a training pathway that will provide greater opportunities for employment and sustainable outcomes.

Existing students will not be disadvantaged and existing subsidy levels will be honoured.
